

Bais Yaakov of Baltimore Achdus Patchwork Quilt Project

On Friday, June 12, special *achdus* care packages were personally delivered to the homes of all Bais Yaakov students. Yes, you read that correctly. Over 1,700 personal deliveries were made, much to the delight of all, from our youngest preschoolers through our oldest graduating seniors.

The deliveries were made by a group of recently graduated seniors, post-high school girls, and several volunteers, who followed routes developed by another outstanding group of volunteers.

Each Bais Yaakov student received a drawstring bag filled with a sweet treat and all the supplies needed to complete her part of the Bais Yaakov Achdus Patchwork Quilt Project.

Each girl was given a gray square of fabric, her patch, and all materials and instructions needed to decorate it. Each girl custom decorated her square of fabric, and then brought the completed patch to a designated drop-off location. Over the summer, all patches will be sewn into one of three quilts. Each quilt will then be hung in one of the three school buildings — elementary, middle school and high school.

During this unprecedented time of disconnection, the Bais Yaakov Achdus Patchwork Quilt Project allowed students to reconnect and once again feel part of a whole. It provided girls with a unique artistic medium within which they were able to creatively express their thoughts, feelings and experiences.

Much appreciation is due to all the special Bais Yaakov parents who partnered in helping their daughters complete their patches, and then delivering the patches to one of the drop-off locations throughout the community. The participation in this project was absolutely phenomenal, and the creativity of the students was amazing. A tremendous debt of gratitude is also due to the exceptional committee of volunteers who made this project possible.

As Mrs. Yocheved Lieder, one of the organizers of the project, remarked, "It is our *tefillah* that just as we sew each patch into a large quilt, our girls will once again be able to learn together in their classrooms as part of our larger Bais Yaakov family."
