# Bais Yaakov of Baltimore Hosts Technology Event

## Sparks Reignited: An Oorah Bar Mitzvah

A non-religious family from Brighton rented a house upstate to celebrate their son's bar mitzvah. They didn't know much beyond the fact that a Rabbi was supposed to "do something Jewish." The local Chabad *shaliach* wasn't available but remembered that Oorah was holding a *Shabbaton* for their *kiruv* families that week, located just a short drive away at TheZone in Stamford, New York.

Rabbi Yisroel Kleinman, veteran Oorah volunteer, agreed to drive down on Sunday, even though he had been in a rush to leave. There, he met "Jake," who didn't know his own Hebrew name, nor what it meant to become bar mitzvah.

"We're not going to have time to

discuss all the responsibilities that a Jew has, but let's at least start your career today by learning about the *mitzvah* of *tefillin*," Rabbi Kleinman said.

He gave Jake a yarmulke, helped him wrap the tefillin, and together, the two said the brachos word-forword. Those in attendance followed every move with fascination, and Rabbi Kleinman helped them all recite Shema Yisrael and v'Ahavta. One by one, the men lined up to take a turn with Rabbi Kleinman's tefillin—all but one, that is.

Jake's father held out until the very end, saying that the last time he had put on *tefillin* was 40 years before. At the very end though, he, too, approached Rabbi Kleinman and explained that as a child growing up in the Soviet Union, he'd never had a good feeling about religion. But
